Youth Gardening

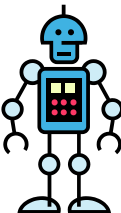
After-school program where youth learn concepts of gardening, horticulture and the interrelationships between plants, animals and soil.

New Clubs are easy to start and always welcome! To start a club, gather 5 friends and 2 adults with a shared interest area or community and call Terry Misch, King George 4-H Agent, at 775-3062.

What is 4-H? 4-H is a voluntary, informal education program for boys and girls who are ages 9-19. To enroll, participants must turn 9 between October 1st and September 30th. 4-H is open to everyone regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, veteran status, national origin, handicap or political affiliation. Additionally, 4-H Cloverbuds is a program for youth ages five to eight.



4-H Camp is available to youth ages 9-13 in King George. Applications are released late February, and camp is during summer at the Northern Virginia 4-H Center. It's 5 days of fun and learning without electronics and TV!

4-H Congress is the premier state teen event. Held at Virginia Tech each June, this event hosts state elections and competitions, Great Summer Showcase educational workshops, college tours of different areas of study and social activities for teens from across the state.
